On October 1, "The President's Own" U.S. Marine Band will depart for its 1994 Concert Tour. The band will present concerts in western Maryland, central West Virginia, Kentucky, southern Indiana, southern Illinois, Missouri, Kansas, Idaho, Colorado, Utah, Washington, Oregon, California, Nevada, and Arizona. ACTIVITIES UPDATE

White House Highlights

June 13 - The Marine Band and Chamber Orchestra performed for the reception, State dinner and after-dinner dancing for the Official State Visit of the Emperor and Empress of Japan, hosted by President and Mrs. Clinton.

July 1 - The band performed on the White House South Lawn for the annual Presidential Scholars Award Ceremony.

July 4 - The band and Dixieland band performed on the South Balcony prior to the annual Independence Day fireworks.

July 25 - The band and orchestra performed for the Official State Visit of Prime Minister Rabin of Israel and King Hussein of Jordan on the occasion of the "Washington Declaration" peace agreement.

International Visitor

During the month of June, the Marine Band was host to LtCol Richard Waterer, Principal Director of Music for the British Royal Marines.

Art Buchwald Sounds Off for Band

In the January 1994 issue of *Parade Magazine*, syndicated columnist Art Buchwald wrote about his experiences in the Marine Corps and how they affected his life. He praised the Marine Band's performance at this year's Gridiron Dinner, an annual event for the Washington press.

To honor this well-known and respected "friend of the Marine Band," Colonel Bourgeois (pictured above, on right) presented Mr. Buchwald with a portrait of "The President's Own." While finding an appropriate place on his wall for the photo, Buchwald went on to say: "I don't believe

that the Marine Corps could exist without the Marine Band. It is the sound of the band that makes us march with our heads held high. The only people who REALLY know how to play the 'Marines' Hymn' are members of the band. Is it any wonder that they are also the only ones who can play 'Hail to the Chief' and make the President happy."

Verdict Reached in Trial

Two defendants were convicted in the 1993 carjacking death of Marine Band trombonist GySgt Dale Fredericks. One defendant received two life sentences plus two years in prison for capital murder, robbery, and the use of a firearm in the commission of a felony. In a separate trial, the accomplice was convicted of first-degree murder, robbery, and use of a firearm in the commission of a felony. Sentencing is set for September 30, 1994.




